• Ava Rail Bridge walkway

Great news! The closure of the public walkway across the Ava Rail Bridge has been pushed back until the end of the year. Hutt City Council is working with KiwiRail to find a solution to maintain access for pedestrians and cyclists in the longer term. Stay alert for local news updates.

Have your say on Hutt City's proposed District Plan!

Hutt City Council's proposed District Plan is out, and it will shape the city for the next 10–15 years. **This is your only chance** to have a say. **Proposed changes for Moera include:**

- **Moera Neighbourhood Hub and Reserve** (and other libraries): Proposed re-zone from 'recreational use' to 'mixed use,' which would allow industrial activity.
- **Natural hazards:** Many properties in Moera may no longer be able to be developed further, due to risks from flood, tsunamis, and sea-level rise.
- **Māori cultural site:** A new site of significance for Māori is proposed at the Seaview entrance, recognising the area's cultural importance.

You have until **Friday 4 April 2025** to submit your thoughts. Whether for or against, your submission matters. For more information, visit the Hutt City Council website www.huttcity.govt.nz/council/district-plan/district-plan-review


Connect with your neighbours

Tsunami emergency: Travel north

Moera is in earthquake and tsunami zones. If you feel a strong earthquake (**over a minute of shaking or strong enough to knock you down**), **move inland or to higher ground immediately** after the shaking stops. Most in Moera should **travel north over the road bridge across the railway tracks**.

Be prepared! Have a grab bag ready!

Possible improvements:

- water blast footpaths
- remove graffiti
- water blast and paint shopfronts
- pick up rubbish from nearby areas
- clean empty shop windows
- fix broken windows
- care for green spaces
- repaint road markings.
